

## LEGAL AND JUSTICE: NEW REPORTS FOR TREND ANALYSIS

The Legal and Justice Systems committee has recently asked INDEX to construct specific reports to provide information on the following questions:

- **What is the average length of jail stay over a certain period of time for different categories of inmates (pretrial, post-conviction, age, etc.) and offenses.**
- **Of the people who are out on bail, how many commit new crimes and end up in jail again within a certain timeframe.**

Some outstanding questions in the data list need further detail from the committee before INDEX can tease out the factors for a report. Additional outstanding questions from the data list include:

- The number of people who are diverted from jail
- Sort data by warrant, booked offense, final charge (felony), or booked citation charge (gross misdemeanor) to create reports, such as:
  - did warrants increase or decrease with the implementation of phone call reminder programs and other programs
  - the number and scope/nature of warrants issued.
  - how many people have warrants in multiple jurisdictions
- Number of persons for whom probable cause exists for arrest, who are diverted to a) Mental Health Triage and/or b) Substance Abuse treatment at the new Triage Center;
- Number of persons for whom probable cause exists for arrest, who are diverted to other mental health facilities (St. Joseph's, etc.);
- Identify how many people with minor misdemeanors and no warrants are due to the officers choosing to either not book, divert, or refer to the Prosecutor

## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH and CRISIS STABILIZATION ADDITIONS TO THE DATA MATRIX

Behavioral health data factors collected while an inmate is housed in the main jail could also be added to the matrix include:

- Identified behavioral health disorder(s)
- Does the inmate have a serious and persistent mental illness
- What kind of substance use disorder
- What are the legal charges that allows the inmate to be diverted from the jail to crisis stabilization

Is this information being collected currently? If so, by whom?

The INDEX Committee has focused on the legal and justice system data questions. In addition to legal and jail data, the staff in the new crisis stabilization facility will collect data and report monthly to the Health Department (*See the CSF monthly reporting form*). This data source and the data points collected could be added to the data matrix master.
