If passed, these amendments would require that the number of signatures required for an initiative petition be based on a number equaling at least eight percent of the votes cast in the "last regular county executive election" rather than the current "last regular gubernatorial election" and that the number of signatures required for a mini-initiative petition be based on a number equaling at least three percent of the votes cast in the "last county executive election" rather than the current "last gubernatorial election."
