**This document identifies the State of Washington offenses that meet the definition of a violent offense for the purpose of administering the Public Safety Assessment (PSA). The PSA definition specifies that offenses are considered violent when a person causes or attempts to cause physical injury to another person. The specific criminal offenses that meet the PSA definition of a violent offense have been identified and are listed below. Note: all attempts, conspiracy, solicitation, and accessory before the fact, of any of the offenses below also meet the definition of a violent offense for the purpose of administering the PSA.**
